

It has been great for James to have Simon as his support worker. James now realises that it's his time to do things he wants to do and to go out without mum & dad. He is always excited about his next outing, and is learning transferable life skills like planning, time and money management, as well as improving his communication. It has made him more confident in moving around the community and a bit more independent in general. We were initially very anxious about the idea of a support worker but having Simon on 'team James' has been fantastic! We can see how happy James is.



We have a nice chats, sometimes we have hot chocolates, once we saw Eddie Betts at the park and another time we saw a friend Oliver went to school with. We meet dogs who are walking along Ferndale Park and have a pat. Each week we walk around the suburb, choosing a new way to go and do physiotherapy exercises prescribed by Oliver's team. Oliver practices road safety and chooses when best to cross the road. On our walks we have read notices about local elections and community events.

The Nunawading Toy Library is a community-based, volunteer run, not-for profit organisation, which recognises play as a major factor in child development. We provide a borrowing service where parents and carers can borrow a large variety of educational toys, puzzles and games on a regular basis.

Being a volunteer run service we rely on our members and community to assist with the operational running of the toy library on a weekly basis.

Sean has been volunteering regularly as a community volunteer since 2018 and contributes to the success of the toy library.

Sean helps us to return items to the shelves by checking that they are complete, clean and in good condition ready for the next borrower before the next borrowing session ensuring that we keep our items in regular circulation and allow for play opportunities where they are needed.

We enjoy Sean's company at the toy library. It is fantastic having him here with his support team, he works hard at each session ensuring that our returns trolley is empty and items are correctly stored on shelves.


