# Message from the CEO.

***Finally, we see the start of a New Year!***

***The last one has been very difficult for everyone involved with Burke and Beyond due to the effects of COVID-19 and the on and off nature of service delivery through the year. It is so refreshing to see people back through our services and there are smiles all around as people finally catch up with each other in person. Everyone seems to be enjoying their return to the services. With vaccinations around the corner for most of our participants and staff, there is a general sense of optimism around at this time.***

***There is also unfortunately a lot of apprehension about where the NDIS is currently heading. The drop in the group price planned for July 1 is bringing on a lot of extra work for our Administrative Team as well as our Coordinators and Support Workers in order to get ourselves ready to manage that change. Many of you will be contacted over the next three months in order to renew your service agreement with Burke and beyond and this is due to that change in pricing. Make sure that you ask all the questions that you need to so that you are very clear on those changes.***

***The other main issue will be the introduction of Independent Assessors. The Federal Government has expressed that this change will go ahead and we now know that they don't need to discuss this in Parliament in order to introduce it. It is felt by many in the industry that this change is taking the NDIS away from its original intent, which was to support a person's life plan by offering the right amount of financial support to do so. The feeling now is that it is becoming a strictly budgetary proposal based on an assessment from someone who has very basic knowledge of disability, and no knowledge of the person. There has been a lot of criticism of this idea recently, including from Bruce Bonyhady, who was one of the originator of the scheme, who is absolutely opposed to this. I, and the majority of my peers across the country are very worried about the effect of this coming into place and what it will do to the people deserving the support.***

***I think we are in for another complicated year ahead.***

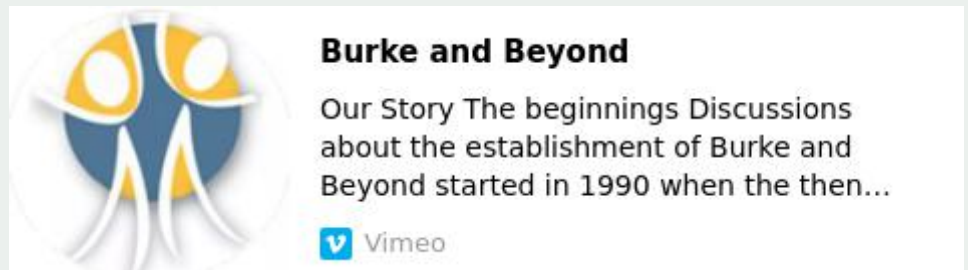
